

Nancy J. Haley, Ph.D.

Dr. Nancy Haley received her doctoral degree from St. John's University in New York in Biochemistry. She trained at the Rockefeller University in cardiovascular pathology with 2 Nobel laureates, Christian deDuve and George Palade before joining the American Health Foundation where she was Head of Clinical Biochemistry. She has received several research awards from the National Cancer Institute and the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute and was responsible for the first "Know Your Cholesterol" campaign to promote public awareness of cardiovascular disease risks. Her research in tobacco related diseases was seminal in the banning of smoking on U.S. airlines and in the determination of risk from exposure to environmental tobacco smoke. From 1990 until 2005, Dr. Haley was Vice President and Laboratory Director at MetLife with responsibility for companywide laboratory testing and information. She joined Dade Behring in 2006 as Scientific Specialist for Dimension Vista® and has presented many lectures and seminars on disease management with laboratory ultraintegration. Currently, she is a member of the Disease State Marketing at Siemens Healthcare Diagnostics where she provides CEU and CME-accredited seminars on emerging technologies such as LOCI®, with a focus on cardiovascular, oncology, and infectious diseases.



Dr. Haley has published over 200 articles in peer-reviewed journals and has written over 15 chapters in educational texts. She has lectured at several international meetings on cardiology and cancer risk and has appeared on Good Morning America, David Letterman and the World News with Peter Jennings. She is a licensed clinical laboratory director in the areas of chemical pathology, toxicology and immunology. She is a member of the American Academy of Insurance Medicine, the American Association of Clinical Chemistry and the American Heart Association as well as Captain of the Fire Rescue Team of the Armonk Fire Dept.
