

Bio: Clayton L Reynolds

- ⌘ Tonight's presentation focuses on Laboratory and Imaging aspects of thyroid disease in a clinical setting.
- ⌘ For the past 12 years our speaker, Dr Clayton Reynolds, has concentrated on delivering endocrine services to Rural and Remote communities in BC. He visits communities from 1 to 5 times each year. He can do that because he no longer has a standard medical practice and his wife thinks (after 48 years of co-habitation) that he is too boring to be at home all the time.
- ⌘ During the past 4 years he has been adding teleconferencing sessions to supplement his in-person visits and to extend his geographic reach. This new technology will also extend his working life by curtailing a heavy travel schedule.
- ⌘ Prior to his current travelling duties, he had worked in California for 21 years, with professional activities ranging from primary care to internal medicine, endocrinology, surgical assisting, quality medicine, utilization management and medical staff affairs.
- ⌘ For the final 5 years in the USA, he was a physician executive with Los Angeles County Department of Health. He worked in Lancaster, California as Chief of Ambulatory Care. Lancaster is in the northern area of LA County, occupying the western edge of the Mojave Desert.
- ⌘ As a second year medical student he was convinced that he wanted to be an endocrinologist. The main attraction to that specialty was the realization that so much of the practice of endocrinology revolves around "objective" parameters, mostly having to do with laboratory testing.
- ⌘ His interest in TeleHealth led fairly directly to tonight's presentation: while in Masset, BC, for a clinic, he spoke with the Hospital Lab staff about a routine Lab issue and the conversation widened, to include the use of videoconferencing. So here he is tonight.
